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27 Years

Contracts are in placed to kick of FY25 on July 1, of 2024. This year P4F will be celebrating 27 years of providing funding for early childhood services in our area.

In FY98 we started with the HOPES program in each county, the Child Care Project which worked with the registered home providers and the full time area director. It seems we have come full circle in providing a variety of projects over the years and now we are back to only the HOPES program in all four counties along with the Child Care Project which now focuses on the licensed centers and preschools along with some support to the Child Care Nurse Consultant and a part time area director.

Our original grant was for \$637,000 and this year we were awarded \$514,230. The highest amount we were ever allocated was \$829,000 in FY08. While money had decreased over the years the programs have remained strong and continue to serve the families and providers in our area.

As we look to the future and alignment with HHS we will advocate for increased funding to again widen our scope of service through out our four county area.



Benefits for Participants

WIC and Senior FMNP participants can receive vouchers to purchase fresh, unprepared, locally-grown fruits, vegetables, and herbs. FMNP vouchers may only be used from June 1 to October 31 at <u>FMNP-authorized farmers markets and farmstands</u>.

How To Use Vouchers

Not all vendors are certified to accept FMNP vouchers, only use your FMNP vouchers where the "WIC and Senior Farmers Market Vouchers Accepted Here" sign is displayed, with a current year certification sticker. FMNP vouchers cannot be used in grocery stores.

- FMNP vouchers are worth \$5.00, and no change is given. But you may use cash to purchase items other than produce or additional produce.
- FMNP vouchers may only be used to purchase fresh, unprepared produce and not to purchase items such as popcorn, ornamental pumpkins, gourds, baked goods, eggs, jam or jelly, nuts, plants, flowers, crafts, etc.
- Honey may be purchased only with Senior FMNP vouchers.
- The certified vendor must be present to accept the FMNP vouchers.
