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FY25

The P4F board meet on May 16th and was posed with tough decisions regarding Fiscal Year 2025 (FY25) funding. Funding from the state will be down \$5000 and P4F has reached the point of little carryforward being passed on year to year. That and the increased cost the programs incur lead to tough decisions that had to be made.

The board agreed that they did not want to do an across the board cut and put programs in jeopardy of not having a quality program. Their approach was to cut programs that may affect fewer children or there may not be enough funds to serve all the children needed. The choice was made to discontinue offering preschool tuition assistance and to not fund the Oral Health program for preschoolers. Duhrkopf will work with preschools to find other avenues for funding and with the Oral Health program to communicate to the dentist that they screenings will not be taking place.

Other programs sustained cuts that may result in a reduction of hours. Should P4F have some carry forward dollars they will attempt to fill in some gaps left by the cuts.

Early Childhood Iowa Funding

Early Childhood Iowa funding levels have been released. P4F and all the ECI Areas in the state are in a unique situation. The funding level at the state level was status quo, meaning the same as last year. But that does not mean local ECI areas receive the same amount of funding. This is due to the formulas that are used to allocate ECI funds. The formula's include population data, child population data, and income related data. Due to either slight declines in our area or significant increase in other counties P4F funding will go

down by \$5000 in FY25. While \$5000 does not seem like a lot in a \$500,000 budget it can impact whether a small program receives funding or not.

Historically P4F has had some carryforward funding that we put back into programing the following year. We are allowed to carry forward up to 20% of our allocation, historically we have had 12-16% carry forward. Due to programs going, increase cost and status quo funding we will not have that level of carryforward to put toward programs in FY25.
